Cultural Corner

Boston Marathon

The Boston Marathon is the oldest footrace in the United States. It was first held on Patriot's Day, April 19, 1897. The Boston Athletic Association organized the first race which involved 15 runners. Today as many as 22,000 runners participate in the race. It wasn't until 1972 that women were allowed to run in the race. John J. McDermott was the winner of the first Boston Marathon. At first the race was always held on Patriot's Day. Patriot's Day is a holiday that commemorates the start of the Revolutionary War. It is celebrated in Massachusetts and Maine. In 1969 the race was officially moved to the third Monday in April.

In 1897 the race was 24.5 miles long, but was lengthened to 26.2 miles in 1924 in order to align with the Olympic race. The race begins exactly at noon in Hopkinton, Massachusetts. It includes the "Heartbreak Hill" area which is the final hill in the race. The race ends in front of the Prudential Center in downtown Boston. Women weren't allowed in the race until 1972 because the Amateur Athletics Union had not formally accepted the participation of women in long distance running. In 1966 Roberta Gibb was the first woman to run the full Boston Marathon. She hid in the bushes near the starting line until the race began. She ran in the race for 3 years, but never with an official race number. Finally, the A.A.U. allowed women to enter its races in the fall of 1971. Nina Kuscsik was the first woman winner of the Boston Marathon in 1972. There are many interesting stories that have come out of the Boston Marathon. John Kelley won the race two times, in 1935 and 1945. He was the second place finisher seven times. He ran in his last Boston Marathon in 1992 at the age of 84. Ellison "Tarzan" Brown won the race two times, in 1936 and 1939. He was a Narragansett Indian who chopped wood to train for marathons. In his first Boston Marathon (in 1935) he threw off his shabby shoes and finished 13th in his bare feet! In 1938 it was so hot that he took a break at the nine-mile mark for a quick swim in Lake Cochituate.
