Cultural Corner



Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was a minister and a leader of the civil rights movement in the United States. Martin Luther King was born on January 15, 1929. Every year he is honored on the third Monday in January. As Martin Luther King was growing up, black and white people were separated from each other. They could not attend the same schools, drink from the same water fountains, or eat in the same restaurants. Dr. King led peaceful protests against this injustice and made many inspirational speeches. He is most known for his "I Have a Dream" speech in which he said "I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character." He became the youngest man to win the Nobel Peace Prize and inspired many to support the civil rights movement. In 1964 the Civil Rights Act was passed. This outlawed segregation in public places and did not allow discrimination in education and employment. In 1968 Martin Luther King went to Memphis, Tennessee to lead a protest in support of striking black garbage workers. He was killed while standing on the balcony outside his motel room. He will always be remembered as a leader of the civil rights movement.
