Cultural Corner

Guy Fawkes Day

Guy Fawkes Day is celebrated in England on November 5. It is also called Bonfire Night. It is celebrated in remembrance of the failure of the Gunpowder Plot. Guy Fawkes is a famous traitor. On Nov. 4, 1605 thirty-six barrels of gunpowder were discovered in a cellar beneath the houses of Parliament in London. People were unhappy with the way King James I of England treated Catholics. They came up with a plan to blow up Parliament, and the King and Queen on the opening day of Parliament. Guy Fawkes was chosen to set off the explosion. One of the conspirators was scared and warned Parliament. Fawkes was caught and arrested along with the other conspirators. On January 31, 1606 eight of them were beheaded. Guy Fawkes' head was displayed with the others on pikes at London Bridge! Today children make images of Guy Fawkes and ask passers-by for money. They chant the phrase, "penny for the guy." The images are burned in huge bonfires that night. Fireworks fill the skies. November 5 was made a national day of Thanksgiving in 1606. It was celebrated with a Thanksgiving church service until 1859. After that, the image burning has become the main attraction. Yeomen of the guard reenact the plot each year. They dress in traditional costumes and search the cellar of Parliament. At the bonfire special foods are eaten. Sausages and potatoes may be cooked in the bonfire. Bonfire Parkin, a cake made of oatmeal, molasses, and ginger, and Plot Toffee are also eaten.
