# Alaska Day

Alaska Day is an official state holiday in Alaska on October 18. Alaska is America's 49th and largest state.

The holiday remembers the formal transfers of the ownership of Alaska from Russia to the United States.

This event happened on October 18, 1867 in Sitka, Alaska. Russian colonists who had already made Alaska their home were very sad on this day. Then to make it even worse, during the transfer ceremony, a strong wind caught the Russian flag and tangled it in the halcyards. Someone was lifted up to free the flag.

He then dropped the flag. The wind caught it again and blew it into a group of Russian bayonets. The remains of the flag were torn, but still presented to the wife of Prince Dimitri Maksoutsoff, the last Russian governor of Alaska, as she was weeping loudly. After the transfer Alaska was organized into a territory. It became a state on January 3, 1959.

Today, a three-day festival for Alaska Day is held in the town of Sitka. There is a costume ball, with prizes for the best costumes. There are many special exhibits at the museums. The main event of the celebration is a parade through the town which ends at Castle Hill.

There, they reenact the transfer ceremony that took place in 1867 by lowering the Russian flag and raising the flag of the United States.
