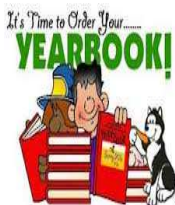
Our 6th grade trip to Sierra Outdoor School is fast approaching! This will be an amazing trip and we have some important deadlines coming up. Please note the following important dates:

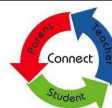
